
00000 Olivaceous Warbler (Iduna pallida)





OLIVACEOUS WARBLER (Iduna pallida)

IDENTIFICATION

12-13 cm. Grey brownish upperparts; whitish underparts; whitish supercilium; brown bill and grey bluish legs; brownish flanks; tail with paler outer feathers and white tips; with bristles near the base of bill.

SIMILAR SPECIES

Similar to **Reed Warbler**, which is brown and has rufous underwing coverts. **Melodious Warbler** has outermost tail feathers without a white patch. **Willow Warbler** is yellow, but is smaller, with more distinct supercilium and narrow bill.

SEXING

Plumage of both sexes alike.

AGEING

2 types of age can be recognized:

Juvenile with fresh feathers; tongue with two black spots.


Adult with worn plumage; tongue without black spots.

In **spring**, after **postbreeding/postjuvenile** moults, ageing is not possible using plumage characters.

MOULT

Complete **postbreeding** and **postjuvenile** moults taking place in wintering quarters
