EURASIAN TREE SPARROW (*Passer montanus*)

IDENTIFICATION

12-14 cm. Chesnut crown, white cheeks with a black spot and a small black bib.

SEXING

Sexes with very similar pattern, if at all, **male** generally with a more intense hazel coloration on crown, blacker bib more defined auricular spot and edge of greater coverts deeper chestnut -coloured than in the **female** (CAUTION: these differences are sometimes very subtle and difficult to discern if the pair is not together). Wing length and bib width are useful characters: **male** with wing longer than 69 mm, bib width larger than 10 mm. **Female** with wing shorter than 67 mm, bib width less than 9 mm. (CAUTION: measurements valid only for Iberian specimens)

SIMILAR SPECIES

Recalls a **Spanish Sparrow male**, which has a chesnut crown too but has steaked flanks and lacks black spot on cheek; the **House Sparrow male** has grey crown and lacks black spot on cheek too.

AGEING

2 types of age can be recognized:

Juvenile resembles **adult** but with least marked colours; median and greater wing coverts tipped buff; with fresh plumage.

Adult with contrasted colours; median and greater wing coverts tipped white; with worn plumage in summer.

After the **postbreeding/postjuvenile** moults, ageing is not possible using plumage pattern.

Complete **postbreeding** and **postjuvenile** moults, usually finished in November.
